Offertory Appeal Results Update

The Offertory Appeal took place in October and you will recall that the results were a bit disappointing – we had been looking for a 25% increase in Offertory income but the pledges

received suggested only about a14% increase.

The actual returns for November 2013, January and February 2014 show better than expected results – a 19% uplift on the same period for last year. NB: December was left out of the analysis as the Christmas offerings skew the results.

There will inevitably be some fall-off as the year goes by but if the uplift were sustained money-wise it would mean an annual increase in Offertory income to £125,000 against the forecast of £120,000 – not as much as we needed but much better than expected. So, a big "thank you" to all who have responded so positively in one form or another to the Appeal. Further updates will be provided during the course of the year. Meanwhile a detailed analysis of the results so far is posted on the Pastoral Council Notice Board and, if you have any questions, please speak to David on 01462-627784.
