#### A Message from Fr Jean-Marie:

#### Dear Parishioners,



Leaving Hitchin on Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> June 2014, the flight landed at Entebbe airport in Kampala-Uganda on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> June 2014 at 1pm with Ethiopian airline. In Uganda I visited the new Assumptionist parish

of Kyabakadde under construction. I stayed 4 days in the parish with my Assumptionist brothers. Finally, on Monday 17<sup>th</sup> I reached my home town of Butembo in the D.R. Congo. Thank God, the political situation is changing in the country and it is now time to rebuild a country completely destroyed. The conditions in which I am living did not allow me to communicate with you. Since July 15th, after installing a solar panel, I am able to use my computer and connect via a modem to the internet of Orange, a telecommunication company based in my home town of Butembo. The solar panel will give some light to my mother and her grandchildren will be able to study their lessons in the evening and spare them some money for buying kerosene for their lamps. I would like to express my heartfelt thanksgiving to all of you for the gift that I have well received from Fr Michael. Looking forward to hearing from you, I wish you all the best. 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All Day Mass at Our Lady's School: was a wonderful opportunity for our children to see the Mass and its main elements, separately. We started with the Entry Rites up to the Opening Prayer at 9.30am. The Readings were then given to Year 6 to produce their thoughts about it and what sort of Mission they need to fulfil to ensure that they play a full and active part in our Parish Life and eventually that of our local Society. They came back and shared their thoughts and insights in action and in word and we spent time praying about what they said as they were addressed to those who will still be in the School in September. We affirmed our Faith by singing the Creed and concluded with the Bidding Prayers, before lunch. The presentation of gifts and Eucharist formed the third part at 2.00pm, when the badges of office of the School Leaders were brought up as well as work which had been done to underline the message of the Gospel as interpreted through Paul's letter to Corinthians. After Communion the and thanksgiving, Mrs Brown called forward the School Leaders currently in post and then announced the names of the Captains who would take over from after the Inter-House Assembly, she then welcomed the new Head Boy and Girl to their positions. All then pledged their time to serving the School as best they could for the coming year. The Assembly then prayed a blessing over Year 6, who then did the same over the gathered Assembly. The rest of the School then came in and there was a prayer of blessing over them. The Mass concluded with a Mission to outreach to the Secondary Schools to which our chidlren were going and a final Hymn. A wonderful day and well organised and very focussed, our thanks and appreciation go to the organisers of the Day.

#### Church Cleaning



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We have an urgent need for more people to help keep our church clean during the week and on Saturdays. Traditionally the cleaning times have been Monday morning

before 10am Mass and Saturday Morning before 10am Mass. However this is really flexible and teams of 2-3 people can coordinate their time to suit themselves. We just need the following work done:

- Vacuuming the church
- Sweeping/mopping between the pews
- Cobwebs removed and surfaces dusted
- Porch floor washed
- Generally clean where needed

We need this done either on a Monday or Tuesday so that the church is clean after the Sunday Masses and then on Saturday morning or afternoon so the church is ready for Sunday Masses.
