

**Parish Finances 2014** Following the Offertory Appeal held towards the end of last year, we undertook to provide parishioners with a periodic report on the state of the Parish finances.

A summary of the accounts for the first 6 months of the year is shown below.

Thanks to your generous response to the Offertory Appeal and careful control of expenditure, the accounts show an operating surplus of some £13,300, which is somewhat ahead of the budget forecast for 2014, and so we are in a much better financial position than we have been for some time.

However, in the longer term, the Business Plan, summarised below, continues to forecast that, with the anticipated fall-off in Offertory income, the cost of essential property repairs and the pressure of inflation on our operating costs, we will be in an annual deficit position again by 2016 with a cumulative deficit by the end of 2018.
