VISUAL AIDS

- > Lamp or lighted candle.
- > Candle shape cut-outs.

SHARING

Encourage the children to imagine and talk about what the world would be like without light and colour.

Are any of the children scared of the dark?

Do they like being out at night?

Today we have a story about a man who came to see Jesus in the night.



WELCOME AND PROCLAIM THE GOSPEL

Say/sing together:

Praise to you, O Christ, our Saviour. Lord, fill our hearts with the light of your Gospel. Praise to you, O Christ, our Saviour. A reading from the Good News given to us by John. Glory to you, Lord.

One of the teachers, called Nicodemus, came to Jesus by night. He believed in Jesus, and wanted to know more about him.
'Lord', he said, 'I know you are sent by God - how else could you work the signs that you do?'

Thave been sent into the world to save it.

No one who believes in me will be condemned, but whoever refuses to believe will be condemned.

I am the light of the world.

Though the light has come into the world many have shown they prefer

the dark.

That is because they want the dark to hide their wickedness.

It is only wicked people and liars who prefer the dark to the light. Those who live by the truth live in the light.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

DISCUSSION

Who came to see Jesus?
Why did he come at night?
- because many of the Jews were hostile to Jesus.

What did Jesus tell him?

What kind of people like the dark? Why?

And which do the children prefer, light or dark?

Jesus replied,

Remind the children of their baptism, at which they were given a candle and asked to keep the light of Christ burning brightly in their lives.

ACTIVITIES

- > Give out the candle shapes.
- Have the children write or draw on them what they will do next week as a sign that the light of Christ is burning brightly in their lives.
- Have the children renew their baptismal promises:'I promise to keep the light of Christ burning brightly in my life.'
