The annual House to House collection in Hitchin & Villages raises about £18,000 each year. Last year nationally Christian Aid raised £8million from House to House collections, about 78% of its income. The event is one of the biggest ecumenical events in the UK. Here in Hitchin we are in need of

- a) more volunteers to knock on doors and collect. Envelopes and other kit is supplied. The money is counted for you.
