Welcome to our new Parish Year of service and outreach to God's People: we are making a gentle start into a guite momentous year, with new programmes being launched in new and challenging ways and we are continuing to explore and integrate Proclaim 15 evermore fully into our Parish life, through the issues and concerns that we have:

Family life and Marriage support; planning for a period of transition from Fr Michael's time as Parish Priest to new ways with Fr Tom taking over from Pentecost, next year, which we hope to make a special day to thanksgiving for Ministry achieved and in process of developing, with appreciation and thanks given to all who support the Parish in any Ministry and in many other ways which express our strength as Community. The Year of Mercy is being launched later this year and will need to be organised as to how we can celebrate and rejoice in it, as a time of welcoming parishioners who may have fallen away from the practice of their Faith; reaching out to those who have had troubles in their way of life, to name but two priorities.

We are also preparing to share with Fr Michael in his 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Ordination next March: it should be quite a day! The other major project will be the rehousing of our Pastoral Team into purpose created offices, which will be more acessible to anyone who wishes to see them. The House itself will be transformed into two flats, one which Fr Michael will be once he has retired and then the upstairs one would be for a retired Priest of the Diocese or failing that opened to commercial renting, for approved clients.

**Grateful thanks** to Tom McGinnity and John Scott who have modified 3 lengths of the old heating duct - about 6 metres in total by replacing the rattlyloose-grille with rigidly fixed timber topped with carpet. These are on the right-hand side as you come out of the sacristy corridor for parishioners to inspect and comment-on before they do any more. They fit cleanly and don't present a trip hazard , they don't rattle and they're robust to large blokes jumping on them. The carpet used is temporary, and not the final colour. Pilgrimage to Paris - Fr Tom was cycling on day one, raising awareness of the UN Climate Talks in December. Westminster Justice and Peace and friends cycled from London to Newhaven as Phase one of the Pilgrimage to Paris over the Bank Holiday with the help of several parishes on the way. Setting out from Westminster Cathedral on Saturday morning with a big turnout of supporters and spent the three days pedalling across the North and South Downs to the South Coast to raise awareness of the UN Paris Climate talks. Despite steep gradients and torrential rain on two of the days, we got to our hosts in Peacehaven Immaculate Conception Parish not far from the Newhaven Dock safely on Monday afternoon for a great celebration tea. As true pilgrims, we prayed morning and evening, not only for the journey but also for much greater commitment to from our politicians to protect 'our common home'. The great fellowship created means we all plan to take the campaign to Paris in November.


