INTRODUCTION

John the Baptist told the people to ask for God's forgiveness for their sins and to change their hearts. They did not know how to please God or to make him welcome in their lives, so John showed them the way.

SIGN OF THE CROSS

LIGHT THE CANDLES

As you light the altar candles and three candles on the Advent wreath, sing together *See the light*.

SORRY

Christmas is a time of joy and peace, and for wishing goodwill to everyone. As St Matthew reminds us (*cf Matthew 5:23-26*):

'If you are about to come before God to pray and then remember that you have quarrelled with someone, go away first, settle your argument and make your peace with them.'

Listen to the words of this prayer:

Lord Jesus,
please forgive us
if we have said
or done something wrong,
and give us the courage
to forgive others
as you forgive us.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

To welcome today's Gospel sing the Advent Song.

GOSPEL (*cf Luke 3:10-18*)

The people listened to John the Baptist's message and asked him, 'What must we do to be ready for the Lord?'

John answered, 'Be generous and kind, and always ready to share whatever you have with others. Be honest and fair and be happy with whatever you have.'

The people grew excited and many began to think that John might be the Messiah, promised by God. So John told them, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming who will baptise you with the Holy Spirit. He is filled with the power of God, and I am not good enough to undo his sandals.'

DISCUSSION

The crowds wanted to be ready to welcome the Lord. Can you remember what John told them they should do?

- to be generous and kind.
- to be willing to share whatever they had.
- to be honest and fair.
- to be content with whatever they had.

John was preparing the way for someone else. Who was that person?

John came to prepare the people to listen to and act upon Jesus' message of love. The words of John the Baptist are just as important for us today as they were for the crowds long ago, so that we, too, will be ready for the Lord.

Today is the third Sunday of Advent, and we have lit three candles in the wreath. Today's candle is pink, does anyone know why it is pink? - The pink candle is a symbol of 'joy', as we rejoice and look forward to Christmas. The crowds listening to John the Baptist were filled with excitement and joy as they prepared and waited for the coming of their saviour.

Christmas is a very special time of year, an important celebration of Christ's birthday. Jesus came to share his love and happiness with everyone, and we try to do the same by giving presents and sending cards to each other. There are many people who spend Christmas alone or unhappy.

Think about the words of John the Baptist, and then can you suggest some ways we can put them into practice this Christmas?

- By giving what we can to local charities.
- By bringing a card or small gift to someone who lives alone.
- By giving the toys which we have outgrown to local children's homes.

(Encourage the children to share any suggestions and ideas.)

Continue decorating the Jesse tree using these figures or adding scenes to the Advent frieze. Discuss the work completed so far with the children.
