GIFT AID TAX REBATE A big "thank you" to everyone who makes their offerings to the Parish under the Gift Aid scheme. We have now received the tax rebate for offerings made in the last tax year and this came to an amazing total of £25,416.00.

This is one of the largest tax rebates that we have ever received and reflects the fact that so many of you signed up to Gift Aid your Offertory donations during the Appeal, which we held in 2013; and it includes the rebates on all your other donations, which are welcome additions to our return.
