FOCUS OF THE READINGS:

Our readings focus on God's promise of salvation. This salvation is seen in the first reading as the promised land. In the Transfiguration, Jesus shows us the glory to which we are ultimately called. Peter, James and John saw a glimpse of the Resurrected Jesus, and of our future glory. We will live in light and splendor. This revelation is accompanied by its requirement—Listen to him.

Jesus is the One promised by God. Listen to him. FIRST READING: Genesis 15:5-10a, 18
A reading from the book of Genesis.
God said to Abraham.

"Look up at the sky. Can you count all those stars? That's how many people will be in your family."

Abraham believed God, and God was pleased with Abraham's faith, and said to him:

"I am your God,
who brought you away from your home
in Ur of the Chaldeans.

"How can I know that this land will truly be mine?" God said,


"Bring me a young cow, a young goat, a young ram, a turtledove and a pigeon."

REFLECTING ON THE READINGS WITH CHILDREN:

After the Gospel, ask the children to recall what they heard. If they have difficulty recalling, you may wish to help them with questions such as:

- Who did Jesus take with him to the mountain?
- What happened while they were there?
- Who did Peter, James and John see with Jesus?
- What did Peter say?
- What did Peter, James and John hear God say?

Ask the children if they have ever seen previews of coming attractions on television or in a theatre. Help them understand that previews tell us what the coming attraction is going to be like and help us look forward to it.

Help them see that at the Transfiguration, Jesus was giving a preview of what he will be like after the resurrection. He was also showing us that we will be like him. We will live with him in glory. As Jesus was showing this to Peter, James and John, God told them what we must do to live with Jesus in glory forever.

Do you remember what God said to Peter, James and John? God tells us too,

"This is my beloved son; listen to him."

- How do we listen to Jesus today in the Bible?
- in our parents and others who teach us?
- in the good thoughts we have that encourage us to do the right thing?
