An appeal by Tomek and Teresa Pernak. Since year 2013 we have helped to place young Polish people with British families for a week, two or three during summer time. The boys' family is prepared to pay for their staying, so there will be a financial remuneration to the families who accommodate them. We would like to place them for 2-3 weeks in July/August.
