

# Ramblings for Reflection:

The difference between first and second in Motor racing comes down to fractions of a second. The one who comes first is only better by the smallest of a fraction. It would be good to remember this in reading the story of Martha and Mary. Jesus would have been very disappointed if he had not been given something to eat during his visit to Martha and Mary and he had Martha to thank for that. As with all the stories of scripture it helps to ask what does this event teach me about God, about myself, about others? Listening attentively to Jesus, to scripture, is an absolute - and listening in a way that reshapes, reforms, renews our lives and our way of seeing things. Sometimes, the business of our lives leaves us with little time to reflect and listen to what is happening to us and around us and even to those closest to us. It is said that the true maturity of love is when two people no longer need to communicate with words, just being together is all that is necessary. It is as though they see and experience everything together in the same way. This is a maturity that is only discovered by sharing the ups and downs, joys and tragedies of life together and listening to each other with the heart and spending time together. Jesus really enjoyed the meal Martha produced. Maybe Martha would have come off better in the story if she had been grateful to Mary for keeping Jesus company, so that she could cook the best of meals!!
