Ramblings for Reflection:

... none of you can be my disciples unless (s)he gives up all his/her possessions!!!" Does that mean we all have to join a Religious Order or Congregation, like the Assumptionists? Now that would really be interesting When Jesus started his mission, he went from place to place, depending totally on the hospitality of others. But, if they had all given up their possessions, there would have been no hospitality available? A recurring issue in Religious life is that, in owning nothing, no one is responsible for anything, and material items fail to be looked after properly or are easily abandoned. We appoint Bursars to look after all the material goods but this still leaves the question of responsibility. Our vow of poverty demands that we take extra care of everything we use. In the book of Genesis, God placed creation into our care as stewards not owners or possessors - stewards! In fact, we own nothing; everything we have is gift, even those things we worked hard to afford. Everything is gift. As stewards of all that we have at our disposal, we have a sacred responsibility to care for all that we have lovingly, however inanimate the object (viz Laudato Si), just like a child with their precious toy that they carry with them everywhere. Maybe Jesus presents us with an irony. Whatever we call or believe to be our 'Possessions' are really those things that POSSESS us! Not the other way round. What would we do without mobile phones? Could we live without them? Jesus calls us to give up our become possessions and stewards not necessarily Religious.
