Ramblings for Reflection:

The success of the GB Paralympic team at the Olympics to date is testimony to what can be achieved with commitment, belief, perseverance and sacrifice. What is even clearer is that each success achieved was because of a whole community of support, encouragement and love that brought them to their achievement. They teach us about the absolute honesty and totality of their commitment, and of developing their talents to the fullest despite their disability. And there is no doubt that money (that tainted thing) played an important part in the whole process. In Jesus day charging interest on loans was anathema - a sin against God (maybe we should bring that back??) so contracts were written in such a way that they stated that you had borrowed more than you had actually received. The "astute" steward probably just changed the contracts to what was actually loaned. If anything, it was the steward who lost any compensation he would have received from the contract. That we, who belong to the family of God, are not astute in that way is true and to be honoured. We trust people, who let us down and don't keep their promises, again and again. We give money to people begging on the streets hoping it will buy them a meal and, as we turn our backs, they slip into the pub. No, we are not astute and maybe we shouldn't be. I am sure Jesus cured a lot of people who later turned their back on him when he was arrested and he never takes back what he has given!!!

PARISH FINANCES

The Parish Accounts for the half-year to the end of June show an operational surplus of £14,629 thanks, in part, to a generous legacy of £10,000. When other costs and payments due are taken into account, the surplus is reduced to £6,810, which is broadly in line with the budget forecast for the year.
