

#### Ramblings for Reflection:

All of us, without exception, want to be valued and believe we are of value to others. Faith is a gift that reinforces this belief which is possibly why the apostles asked Jesus to increase their faith. What is most reassuring is that, however small or fragile our faith (mustard seed size), Jesus says we will be able to do things way beyond our capabilities. Doesn't this imply that we are valued and empowered to do great things even if our relationship with Jesus appears to be tenuous? This is true affirmation and a sign that that we are lovingly valued. . . Mother Teresa said: "Be faithful in small things because it is in them that your strength lies." . . . "SOMETIMES someone says something really SMALL but it FITS right into that EMPTY PLACE in your HEART." . . . "One small positive thought in the morning can change your whole day." . . . "Maturity is not when we start speaking big things . . . but actually it is when we start understanding SMALL things!" . . . Pope Francis said: "No one can grow unless he accepts his own smallness!" . . "The feelings of my smallness and my nothingness always kept me good company." (Pope John XXIII). Maybe what St Paul meant, when he said that was that we should be mightily proud of our Faith (however small), only in this way will the power and might of the Spirit be able to work though us, its servants!!

# AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 1
