



Ramblings for Reflection: The letter to Timothy reminds us that all scripture is inspired by God and is able to help, inform and guide the choices and decisions we make, warn us off making errors and set us on the path of being the best we can be i.e. Holy. This can happen without ever having studied the history, make up and cultural background of the stories and writers. All that that does is help us not misinterpret the scriptures. Elsewhere wisdom tells us that it not the answers we have discovered in life that enrich our iourney but the guestions we have asked along the way. My Gospel question is: What kind of Justice will God see done? And will it be the same as what I believe Justice to be? I hope (and believe) justice is not about slaughtering people as in Moses day. But the really perplexing question this week is Jesus question: Will Jesus find any faith in us when he returns? And what kind of faith will he be hoping to encounter? Two saints this week Pope John XXIII and Teresa of Avilla were both revolutionaries of faith who broke the trend of the day and turned history on a different course. Each suffered in their own way for the consequences of their decisions but persevered. Both needed the help and support of many others to achieve their goals. Justice and faith requires that we work together to share burdens and successes and to help each other persevere. If our faith is right, not only will Scripture (God) help us but we now know that the more care we show creation, of which we are stewards, then the Earth will help us too!!

The couple that loves and begets life is a true, living icon - capable of revealing God the Creator and Saviour. Fruitful love



becomes a symbol of God's inner life (Genesis1:28, 9:7, 17:2-5,16; 28.3; 35:11; 48:3-4.

(And in Genesis there are) various genealogical accounts (4:17-22, 25-26; 5; 10; 11:10-32: 25:1-4, 12-17, 19-26; 36 (signalling) the ability of human couples to beget life is the path along which the history of salvation progresses.

Seen this way, the couple's fruitful relationship becomes an image for understanding and describing the mystery of God himself, for in the Christian vision of the Trinity, God is contemplated

As Father, Son and Spirit of love. The triune God is a communion of love, and the family is its living reflection.
