Ramblings for Reflection:

As we approach the end of the present cycle of year C, our scripture readings become much more troublesome, worrying and challenging. And yet, Jesus tells us not to be afraid whatever happens. What is encouraging for our faith is that Jesus never tried to hide the reality of what could happen to us. He made it very clear that following him would not be all sweetness and happiness. But, as with any true relationship, he repeatedly encouraged us to trust him. There is always the danger of focusing on the end time so that it clouds our vision of the present. We end up worrying about things that might happen. Which, if they do not occur, all our worrying will have been in vain and, if they do happen, all our worrying beforehand will not change what happens. If anything, these readings should encourage us to work harder in loving our neighbour, working for peace, protecting our environment, being people of Good News. Of all the calls Jesus makes to us to trust in him, let us remember that Jesus places his complete trust in us; otherwise you would not be baptised (or be reading these Ramblings?). AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 6

Chapter 1 *In the Light of the Word (continued)*.

Let us once more take up the song of the Psalmist. In the home where husband and wife are seated at table, children appear at their side "like olive shoots" (Ps 128:3), that is, full of energy and vitality.

If the parents are in some sense the foundations of the home, the children are like the 'living stones' of the family (cf. 1 Pet 2.5) Significantly, the word which appears most frequently in the Old Testament after the name of God (YHWH, "the Lord"), is "child" (ben, "son"), which is itself related to the verb "to build" (banah).
