

Ramblings - Feast of Christ the King C 2016

However great a person is, however much we admire them or are inspired by them, there comes a point in our lives when we secretly want to know what the person is like at the lowest moment in their life, when they are really up against it. It would seem that that is the position of the liturgist who chose the reading for the day when we celebrate the kingship, the true glory of Christ who is both our king and our brother. The day we celebrate his absolute victory over evil and death. So the gospel takes us into the presence Jesus at the lowest moment of his life, hanging on the cross, where he even feels forsaken by his Father. The crowds are jeering at him, mocking him. How tempting it must have been to come down from the cross just to show them!!! But he doesn't. What does Jesus do? He hears the words of the 'good' thief who acknowledges the innocence of Jesus and the injustice of his punishment. And whatever evils the good thief may have committed are not only forgiven but he is assured a place in the heavenly kingdom the same day. Instead of saving himself at the lowest point in his life, Jesus chooses to save someone else. Isn't that the kind of King in whose kingdom you would want to live????

We need a couple more people to help

with the counting of the non-offertory collection on a Monday morning. Teams meet at about 9ish and empty the money boxes in the church and count that and any other monies that have come in during the week. It takes about an hour and is a vital service to offer the parish. If you can spare an hour once a month on a Monday please speak to Trish or David Wilson.

Also we need volunteers at the 8.30am Mass to take up the collection. Ideally 3 people should do it. All you do is gather the collection bag from the back of the church, hand it out to the congregation at the appropriate time and count the number of people at the Mass by clicking a counter as you pass the bag along. If you are a regular at 8.30 Mass please get up to help with this ministry which is vital for the financial well-being of the parish. Thank you in anticipation.

Grateful thanks to Tony, John and Brian who worked so hard to repair the damaged areas of the car park. During the coldest spell of weather we have had for a while they valiantly battled to get the work done and minimise the disruption to car park users. We are very lucky to have such wonderful parishioners who give us their time and labour.

AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 7

Chapter 1 In the Light of the Word (continued).

We know the New Testament speaks of "churches that meet in homes" (cf. 1 Cor 16:19; Rom



16:5; Col 4:15; Philem 2). A family's living space can turn into a domestic church, a setting for the Eucharist, the presence of Christ seated at its table.

We can never forget the image found in the Book of Revelations, where the Lord says "Behold, I stand at the door and knock; if any one hears my voice and opens the door, I will come in to him and eat with him, and he with me (Rev 3:20). Here we see a home filled with the presence of God, common prayer and every blessing.



Health and Safety inspection for our parish is coming up in December. A number of members of the parish have been working hard to ensure that we make our facilities as safe as possible for all the parishioners and users. One thing we need to do is have a practice evacuation from the church. This will be unannounced so if it happens at the Mass you are asked to please be patient and follow the instructions given. We will do our best to ensure it does not interfere with the Mass and minimise the inconvenience to our parishioners.

Information to prepare you

Full details of the evacuation procedure are available in the porch. An extract of what you need to do follows:

At the point of identification that an evacuation is necessary the Priest will announce to the congregation that we need to evacuate the church and the congregation should follow the instructions of the Fire Wardens who are identified by the yellow vests.

- a. The MC will evacuate the altar servers and the Priest through the sacristy corridor (providing this is not taking them to the source of any fire)
- b. The members of the congregation to the left of the altar (as you face the altar) will leave the church through the sacristy corridor (providing this is not taking them to the source of any fire) and will leave the corridor through the doors to the right and left at the top of the corridor.
- c. The members of the congregation to the right of the altar and around the organ will leave the church through the main entrance and leave through the porch.
- d. (10.30 Mass only) All the children in the children's liturgy groups in the hall and committee rooms will be evacuated by the back entrance of the hall. Parents should proceed to the back door of the hall to collect their children from whichever exit you leave the church. The Catechists will remain with the children until they have all been collected.
- e. Once out of the church all members of the congregation should leave the church grounds immediately as it is necessary to clear the cars from the car park as soon as possible so that any fire fighting appliances can gain access.
- f. People need to walk calmly and not rush to exit the church. All able bodied people need to leave immediately to create space for the less able. Families with children should leave immediately, other adults should offer to support the less able bodied. Parents who have altar servers at the Mass should meet them at the car park and not look for them in the sacristy.
- g. Fire wardens will be in the car park to assist the smooth emptying of the car park.

 All cars should turn left out of the car park.
