This weekend

3pm Sunday afternoon, we are holding our next Service of Healing and Wholeness. Parishioners who feel the need for these gifts are invited to share in this time of prayer, during which the Sacraments of Reconciation and Anointing will be celebrated.

Parish Finances Along with those of other Parishes, the Hitchin Parish Accounts for the year ending 31 December 2015 have now been "signed off" at the Diocese and, with adjustments for payments due and a transfer to reserves, the figures show an operating surplus of £19,848.

This result was better than forecast thanks to the efforts of many people, not least, you the parishioners - "thank you". The reasons including the fact that Offertory Income did not fall-off as much as we had predicted; income from the hall remained high; and the Michaelmas Fair was very successful. At the same time, housekeeping and liturgical costs were reduced as were repair and maintenance overheads thanks, in particular, to the efforts of the Maintenance and Gardening teams. Moreover, amongst other things, we managed to absorb expenditure on replacing the cooker and providing a new washing machine and a dryer in the Presbytery; significant repairs to the gas boiler and kitchen equipment in the hall; the purchase of new smokeless Votive Candle stands for the Church: and replacement of the Church lights.

Announcement for the Parish from the PPC & **Finance Planning team**

Some time ago we promised the Parish that we would look for all means to ensure the best use of Parish funds.

To this end the Parish finances were looked at as a whole, and the conclusion was reached that investment in Grove Road House would achieve a better return than leaving Parish money sitting in the bank at historically low interest rates.

There have been eighteen months of exploratory work, consultation with Planning Authorities, support and advice from the clergy and the Diocese.

This has resulted in agreement and approvals from all parties to go ahead with a building project refurbishing Grove Road House.

This project will result in a ground floor flat for Father Michael and an upstairs flat for a retired clergyman. In addition the existing garage /storeroom building will be converted into a new Pastoral Centre.

Building work is planned to commence shortly after Christmas. Prior to then, the plans and proposals for site safety will be posted in the hall for everyone's information. ****

Recycling achievement report for our parish In this season of Advent we bring glad tidings from the recycling projects in our parish! As a LiveSimply



Parish a number of collections of various waste items are on-going in the parish, working together with the Terracycle company and others, to raise funds for the parish and other charities. The LiveSimply team say a BIG THANK YOU to everyone that in the last 12 months (1st Nov15 to 31st Oct16) has contributed items for recycling. In total we have raised **£531.00**.

Below is a summary but full details can be found on the parish website and copies are available in the porch also.

The Writing Instruments appeal – funded by "Bic" we have collected just over 40kg, which raised £80.00 for the North Herts Sanctuary across the road. Currently there are two Primary schools collecting for us, they are Our Lady's and White Hill, but I would love it if all schools in Hitchin would come on board as well. Is there anyone able to help this to happen?

The Coffee Packaging appeal – funded by "Kenco" we have only collected 23kg, which only raised £25.00 for PHASE. We appeal to all parishioners that drink coffee in your homes and at work - please help us double the collection rate over the coming year.

The Tassimo appeal – funded by "Tassimo" we have collected some 551.5kg (over ½ ton) of all types of Tassimo discs and bags, they raised £326.00 for PHASE, the local charity set-up by Churches Together in Hitchin to provide faith and counselling support in Hitchin secondary schools.

The Biscuit Wrapper appeal – funded by McVities, we have collected almost 11kg, equivalent to about 4500 wrappers, which raised £100.00 for our parish's hardship fund. Other news from now until the end of January 2017 we can take part in their Biscuit Wrapper round-up competition, and if we become one of the top 20 sites in the UK, we could be awarded a share of £500 prize funds on offer, so please bring your wrappers to be recycled! Please note that the wrapper must say that is from a sweet biscuit type product or it will not be accepted by McVities. All savoury product wrappers are excluded.

The Mobile Phones recycling - we recently teamed-up with another company "Phone Recyclers" and have sent them 35 collected mobile phones and raised £100 for the parish funds. However, we have to stop the collection of Laptops/tablet computers since Terracycle have also discontinued that service and we have not yet found a suitable alternative service.

Coloured milk bottle tops or plastic lids – that have been taken to either of the nearest Lush Cosmetics shop in Luton or St. Albans to be re-used in their products packaging manufacturing site. The type of coloured plastic that they use in their factory is only of type HDPE or High Density Polyethylene or type-2,

Our appeal today is for greater support if possible from everyone in the parish.

All that was waste - that did not end-up in a landfill site somewhere on Earth. Once again, it's not money we are after – it's some of your rubbish!

Chapter 1 In the Light of the Word (continued)

Parents have a serious responsibility for this work of education ("And when your



children ask you, 'What does this ceremony mean to You?', then tell them" (Exodus 12:26-27). Children, for their part, are called to accept and practice the commandment: Honor your father and your mother".
