## Ramblings for Reflection

"Rejoice in the Lord always! Again I say Rejoice!" This is a great way to begin any day and this Sunday is given the name 'Gaudete!' Time to rejoice! The circle of light in our Advent wreath is almost closed but this year we are gifted with four full weeks of Advent giving us more time for our preparations . . Not that many years ago when the whole church came together for Vatican Council II in the 60's one of its major documents was called 'Gaudium et Spes' and Pope Francis has focused his letters on this very theme Joy and Hope. When Jesus is asked if he is the Messiah: the Anointed. the Chosen Saviour, the Redeemer, his reply is "Look and See!" Today, we are very aware of where Jesus is not present in our world, in the wars, the injustice, the damage to creation, the poor and the marginalised. So, we need to make a bigger effort to see where Christ is present and where his saving work continues and flourishes: and flourish it does. #### **AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 10**

Chapter 1 In the Light of the Word (continued)

The Gospel goes on to remind us that children are not the property of a family,



but have their own lives to lead. Jesus is a model of obedience to his parents, placing himself under their charge (cf. Lk 2:51) but he also shows that children's life decisions and their Christian vocation may demand a parting for the sake of the Kingdom of God. (cf Mt 10 34-37. Lk 9:59-62)

Jesus himself at twelve years of age, tells Mary and Joseph that he has a greater mission to accomplish apart from his earthly family (cf LK 2.48-50).

In this way he shows the need for other, deeper bonds even within the family: "My mother and my brethren are those who hear the word of God and do it" (Lk 8:21).
