

#### Ramblings for Reflection

Virgin Birth! Where to begin? All birth is sacred, human birth being the most sacred of all: full of mystery, life, hope, joy, and excitement - a most holy moment in time. Circumstances surrounding a birth, however, can colour the way we receive this moment and react to it positively and negatively. The agony and ecstasy of the mother who gave birth to Jesus was like that of any mother giving birth, as was the period of gestation. It is the circumstances of this particular birth that affect the way we understand and receive it. God is involved and fully part of every human birth - we are all made in God's image as well as that of our parents - only in this case the agreement was not between man and woman but between God and woman. and the baby, human like every other human baby. was more than an image of God, he was God. He was Emmanuel - God with us. His birth deepened our understanding of the importance, value and sacredness of the gift of life we have been given, raising it to a level far beyond anything we can perceive, bringing us into a participation in the divinity and sacredness that only God can give. Mary's virginity expresses the total self-giving not just of Mary but of God. We see the evidence and value of this self-giving in the generosity of people over this Advent season, for it is a sharing of life, of love and of God and for a moment that birth of Christ lights up the world to a beauty far beyond description but no less breath taking.

#### **AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 11**

Chapter 1 In the Light of the Word (continued)

Christ proposed as the distinctive sign of his disciples, the law of love and



the gift of self for others (cf. Mt 22:39; Jn 13:34). He did so in stating a principle that fathers and mothers tend to embody in their own lives: "No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends" (Jn 15:13). Love also bears fruit in mercy and forgiveness. We see this in a particular way in the scene of the woman caught in adultery; in front of the Temple, the woman is surrounded by her accusers, but later, alone with Jesus, she meets not condemnation but the admonition to lead a more worthy life (cf JN 8:1-11).
