Ramblings for Reflection

As the bills for Christmas roll in, freezing and wet weather descends upon us, it is encouraging to hear Isaiah speak of gladness and rejoicing, of light overcoming the darkness that oppresses us, because he lifts our spirits. Something exciting is happening! We are always more positive when our expectation of good things are high. St Paul presses the point home by reminding us that the Gospel is GOOD NEWS, a gospel that unites. So, when we hear Jesus calling for repentance, of course we want to shake off the darkness, the depression, or any isolation we may feel. Optimism, joy and happiness call us towards something new and good in our lives that we want to share with others; which, after all, is what repentance is all about. It is a medical fact that if we are positive, optimistic, upbeat about ourselves and our lives that we heal far more quickly from illness. Not only is it good for us but it inspires others, with hope and goodness and the message they preach will also be good news. Jesus' call for repentance is not so much a command rather than the permission that we have been waiting for to renew our lives, even start over, and make our lives light up with hope, or love, with care and compassion for others, which is contagious. AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 16

Chapter 1 In the Light of the Word (continued)

"The welfare of the family is decisive for the future of the world and that of the Church. We do well to focus on concrete realities, since 'the



call and the demands of the Spirit resound in the events of history' and through these 'the Church can be guided to a more profound understanding of the inexhaustible mystery of marriage and the family' (John Paul II, 1982). The Synod Fathers examined the situations of families worldwide, and their pastoral insights are included in this chapter on the experiences and challenges of families (which will be published in the newsletter in the coming weeks), along with concerns derived from my (Pope Francis') own experience. It is my hope that, in reading Amoris Laetitia, all will feel called to love and cherish family life, for families are not a problem; they are first and foremost an opportunity."
