We have just celebrated the feast of the purification when we carry candles symbolising the light of Christ we carry in our lives. ## AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 18

The experiences and challenges of families today

'Consideration needs to be given to the growing danger represented by an extreme individualism which weakens family bonds and ends up



considering each member of the family as an isolated unit, leading in some cases to the idea that one's personality is shaped by his or her desires, which are considered absolute' (Relatio Synodi 2014,5).
