

Ramblings for Reflection



Do we live knowing that we with graced are salvation and with holiness as St Paul says? All the gifts we are given from God (which are many) come with an inbuilt yearning to be shared. But we develop a way of looking at our lives that hides this

vearning and often hides our true gifts from us. Then, something happens in life and a gift is revealed that changes everything for us. The truly talented artist always wants to share their gift with others more than anything and is always seeking more and better ways to do this. Jesus often used a kind of shock tactic to open others to their gifts, in his miracles as well as his preaching. This week he shows himself in all his glory; that he is much, much more than what his disciples see and think of him. Transfiguration is an uncovering and revelation of the beauty and reality of an inner truth, which is a reflection of God. Lent provides us with the shock tactics to see the true value and richness of God in our lives: prayer, fasting and caring for others and creation. When we do this, we see those around us, especially those closest to us, in a deeper and enriched way. "God places us in the world as his fellow workers - agents of transfiguration. We work with God so that injustice is transfigured into justice, so there will be more compassion and caring, that there will be more laughter and joy, that there will be more togetherness in God's world." (Desmond Tutu) ****

Boxes of Planned Giving Envelopes for the coming year will be available for collection in the Hall after each of the Masses next weekend (**18/19 March**). Parishioners who make their offering by Standing Order and would like a supply of Envelopes to use when making an additional offering during the collection at Mass can also collect Envelopes at this time. If you have not already signed up for the Planned Giving Scheme – which plays such an important part in financing the operation of the Parish – you can do so at this time and David and Elizabeth, our Planned Giving and Gift Aid Organisers, will be on hand to provide any information you might require.

Hertfordshire Police have asked that we do not park in their visitor's car park on the side of Hitchin police station at any time. It is in constant use during the week and often at weekends. If you park on the yellow lines (on Sundays only) around the police station please ensure that the police can access their car park behind the main building. They often have to leave at high speed when there is an incident they are called to. Because of the state of high security alert our country is presently at, they need to know that all the vehicles parked in and around the police station are on police business. Anyone parking there who is not on police business will have a polite notice put on their car warning them not to park there in the future. If they continue to park there they will be prosecuted. We will also be notifying all groups using the hall to refrain from parking there also.

We do notify the police whenever we have a funeral so they understand when we have large volumes of cars expected and they do try to accommodate us when they can. We will also be contacting the day centre to ask if we can park in their car park at the weekends. We do appreciate that our parking space in the church is limited for some Masses. It would be good if we can bear in mind that our parishioners with mobility issues and parents with young children need to park as close as they can. Those of us who can walk, more easily, can perhaps consider parking slightly further away. As it is Lent maybe we could consider doing this as a positive action rather than 'giving up something'? Thank you for your consideration and patience. ****

GIFT AID TAX REBATE 2016 = £23,000

The experiences and challenges of families (cont)

We (the Synod) need to be humble and realistic. acknowledging that at times the way we present our Christian beliefs and



treat other people has helped contribute to today's problematic situation. We need a healthy dose of self-criticism. Then too, we often present marriage in such a way that its unitive meaning, its call to grow in love and its ideal of mutual assistance are overshadowed by an almost exclusive insistence on the duty of We have not always provided procreation. solid guidance to young married couples, understanding their timetables, their way of thinking and their concrete concerns. At times we have also proposed a far too abstract and almost artificial theological ideal of marriage, far removed from the concrete situations and practical possibilities of real families. This excessive idealisation, especially when we have failed to inspire trust in God's grace, has not helped to make marriage more desirable and attractive, but quite the opposite.
