Ramblings for Reflection There is talk of a hosepipe ban this summer, and we will be reminded of the importance and value of water. Our consciences will become more sensitive to areas of the world enduring drought and we will be more welcoming of those rainy days we have. Jesus, the water of life, will have more significance for us. We will understand better that we cannot live without him and that our climate will teach us about Jesus and about our Creator. Cleansing and life-giving water leads us to reflect on our baptism in which we are opened to the presence of God in our lives and the mission we are given to share and spread this God given gift. Like all God's gifts, the more we share it the stronger it becomes. This week Jesus again breaks cultural and social norms by speaking to a foreign woman (and an enemy) of ill repute alone. Jesus opens her to the life he offers with the result that the whole town becomes believers – the power of sharing the life received. He offers his life to all whatever their background or however terrible their past. A life that we learned last week transforms and sets free. We love the sun for it brightens our day and our spirits. Let's give the same love and positive welcome to the rainy days ahead, however dull. Let them speak to us of Jesus, the water of life. The water that flowed from his side that Good Friday was a sign that he gives himself and his life completely to us - to be shared.

Monday 10th April 7.30pm Passover Meal in the Church Hall.

To celebrate Passover is to do what Jesus did with his disciples at the Last Supper.



It is a chance for us to understand more deeply our Jewish roots and our Christian Eucharist. The Passover Meal is a family occasion and children form an integral part of the proceedings, so all are very welcome.

We hope to welcome people from St. Mary's Church again this year.

You need to bring: a baked potato for each person, cooked and wrapped in foil (to keep

warm), sufficient wine for 4 toasts, soft drinks/water, cutlery, plates and glasses for each person. Roast lamb is provided. [You can bring salad and toppings for the potatoes as well – to share with those around you, if you wish.]

It is a wonderful way to begin Holy Week. All ages welcome. Please sign up on the board in the porch as we need to know numbers by 3rd April so that we can order the meat.

Shortage of MCs We now have a critical shortage of MCs to help us for Sunday Masses to help set up and support the priest and direct



the altar servers. You do not need to have served on the altar in the past. We can give you full training on what is required to help in this way. It is not difficult but we do appreciate that you are in full view of the parish at Mass. Please do not be reluctant to give this a try at least.

In particular what we would like is someone (or preferably more than one person) who will shadow the MCs at our Holy Week services this year so that we can be assured that we have someone who knows what to do in the future.



The Comeback Prayer Group

Some while ago one of our parishioners went to Mass in Norfolk when visitina relatives. Reading Parish the

newsletter this parishioner noticed that there was a special prayer group that had been set up to make sure that every day of every month there would be someone in the Parish who would pray for those family members or friends who had for any reason fallen away from the practice of the faith.

The prayers would be that somehow and at sometime these people who had fallen away would find their way back or would be led back by the Holy Spirit.

It was then thought that we in Hitchin should try to set up a similar prayer group.

In this Norfolk Parish many of the people on the rota were housebound or carers of those that were housebound. There may be elderly people in old people's homes or nursing homes who would love to still be part of the whole Parish in this way and would love to take part in this very important task.

Please have a think about someone who you think might be willing to join this important rota or even put your name forward yourself. People can even work as a couple or as a small team too.

What we will do in this Parish is to try to get together at least 31 names of people who would like to be part of this group.

We will then decide how we think the rota members could carry this out and devise a prayer or set of prayers that could be used and arrange for everyone to be visited.

The experiences and challenges of families (cont)

We (the Synod) have long thought that simply stressing doctrinal, bioethical and moral issues, without encouraging openness to



grace, we were providing sufficient support to families, strengthening the marriage bond and giving meaning to marital life. We find it difficult to present marriage more as a dynamic path to personal development and fulfillment than as a lifelong burden. We also find it hard to make room for the consciences of the faithful, who very often respond as best they can to the Gospel amid their limitations, and are capable of carrying out their own discernment in complex situations. We have been called to form consciences, not to replace them.
