PASSION: Matthew 27:11-54

The story of the suffering and death of Jesus, from the Gospel of Matthew.

Jesus stood in front of Pilate, the governor of Jerusalem. Pilate asked Jesus,

"Are you the king of the Jews?"

And they put a stick in his hand.

Then they knelt in front of Jesus and made fun of him saying,

"Hail, King of the Jews!"
