

In case we might miss it on Hallelyah! He is risen Easter Glory has filled the sky



over these past couple of weeks. We've never had so much sun, and, doesn't it lift the spirits and inspire hope? The paradox is that it has more effect when we have been through dark, dreary, cold, damp days beforehand. We are resurrection people. People of light and hope and above all JOY. A kind of joy that is infectious, that radiates through the whole of our being, that influences others (even our enemies), that seeps into our conversation and thinking, like the little baby, we are a 'Bundle of Joy'! Macrina Wiederkehr reminds us that "Some of our light has not yet reached our family, our friends, our world. There are pieces of compassion, forgiveness, courage, hope and love in us that have not been fully discovered." Easter tells us that, when we look at our lives and see the cracks and fault lines and even the gaps, these are the places through which Jesus will let his light shine in a special, captivating way. #### **AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 27**

The experiences and challenges of families (cont)

The Synod Fathers have another 15 subchapters (!) acknowledging some of the challenges families around the



world currently face. Pope Francis concludes, "I thank God that many families, which are far from considering themselves perfect, live in love, fulfill their calling and keep moving forward, even if they fall many times along the wav.

The Synod's reflections show us there is no stereotype of the ideal family, but rather a challenging mosaic, made up of many different realities, with all their joys, hopes and problems. The situations that concern us are challenges. We should not be trapped into wasting our energy in doleful laments, but rather seek new forms of missionary creativity. In every situation, that presents itself, 'the Church is conscious of the need to offer a word of truth and hope... The great values of marriage and the Christian family correspond to a yearning that is part and parcel of human existence.'

If we see any number of problems, these should be, as the Bishops of Colombia have said, a summons to "revive our hope and to make it the source of prophetic visions, transformative actions and creative forms of charity."
