

## Ramblings for reflection

Jesus' challenge was how to help us look beyond what we see, experience or feel, and hear more than just the words spoken. We proclaim Jesus as the light, but, if we only look at the light and not beyond, we will fail to see what the light uncovers or reveals. After all, we do not just look at the sun on a sunny day but are captivated by how the sunlight cheers our surrounding; how everything is brighter, more vivid and full of life. We feel invigorated and renewed. We turn lights on to see what's around us, not to gaze at the light. The light of Jesus, however, adds something more. It is not just revelatory, doesn't just provoke us to look beyond the initial image or experience, it also opens us up to a relationship. That is why Jesus kept talking about the relationship he had with his Father and how that relationship inspired, motivated and encouraged him. Anyone who has been in a close, loving relationship with someone begins to intuitively know what the other person thinks, feels and knows, even what they will say. Jesus had this kind of relationship with his Father. This is the intimate relationship the apostles received at Pentecost and which they wanted to share in their preaching. They spoke as if Jesus were speaking through them. They were of one heart and one mind with Jesus. Don't we want this kind of relationship with Jesus and to be this kind of light?

#### **AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 31**

The Vocation of the Family continues: "The Bible presents us with an ideal of life that, if made clear to us, causes us to say "How much I would like to attain such



an ideal!" Only in a second moment do we come to compare that ideal with the reality of our own lives, and the disparity we discover can be very upsetting. In pondering this fact with children, a catechist asks the question" "Would it be better not to know them? Would we live more peacefully without such difficult goals to attain?" And the answer of the children is a "No," resounding because the maxims challenge and inspire us to 'try and try again'. In coming to know the norms, we must first see that they are beautiful and just. This realisation awakens our desire to put them into practice. The foundation of the moral life is, and always will be, that of falling in love. Measuring the distance between ideals and our ability to attain them is always a second step. Only if we respect both moments, both steps, will our practical application of the norms be an expression of love."
