Don't you just wish you were there at the Last Supper with Jesus and his friends? To listen to him speaking in person, feeling his presence, breathing the same air, feeling loved and cared for. Each would have received his words differently and the significance of his words would only be truly assimilated after his passion later. Resurrection. Jesus promised to be with us always, is here with us now, so how does he speak to us, to you, today? Jesus is present in all those who believe (as well as the unbeliever). Among our daily encounters, there are times we are struck by the beauty, goodness, love and/or some other virtue or quality. Teach me, like you, to praise God in the silence of my being. Help me to surrender unnecessary words. Draw me, like a magnet, into the abiding love of God."

Members of the public are being reminded of the silent 999 calls procedure. There is a misunderstanding that police will always attend when a silent 999 call is received - this is not correct. When you call 999 in the UK, your call is answered by a BT or Cable & Wireless emergency operator, who will direct your call to the most appropriate emergency service. If the caller does not respond to the operator to indicate which service they require, they will be transferred to the automated Silent Solutions system. This uses a voice message to ask the caller to confirm they require an emergency service by pressing the digit '5' on their phone twice. If the caller presses the digit '5' twice they will be transferred to the originating emergency operator and the call will be dealt with as normal with enquiries made to try and find the caller. Police will not automatically have

details of where you are – particularly for mobile phones - so we can't automatically send police to your location. Every day the 999 service receives a large number of accidental 999 calls, particularly from mobile phones. Each call is assessed on the available information, such as any previous calls to the police, but will not necessary mean we know where you are. If you are unable to speak, listen to the call operator who will ask questions and give instructions to help you. Our control room operators are skilled in seeking information from callers who may not be in a position to communicate fully. For example, they ask you to cough or tap the phone in response to specific questions in an attempt to pinpoint your location.

# **AMORIS LAETITIA - THE JOY OF LOVE 32**

The Vocation of the Family continues: "The Synod Fathers noted that Jesus, "in speaking of God's original plan for man and woman, reaffirmed the



indissoluble union between them, even stating that 'it was for your hardness of heart that Moses allowed you to divorce your wives, but from the beginning it was not so' (Mt 19:8). The indissolubility of marriage - 'what God has joined together, let no man put asunder' (Mt 19:6) - should not be viewed as a 'yoke' imposed on humanity, but as a 'gift' granted to those who are joined in marriage. indulgent love always accompanies our human journey; through grace, it heals and transforms hardened hearts, leading them back to the beginning through the way of the cross. The Gospels clearly present the example of Jesus who proclaimed the meaning of marriage as the fullness of revelation that restores God's original plan (Mt 19:3)". (Relatio Synodi, 2014, 14)
