Ramblings for Reflection:

Aren't we funny people? We call the parable this week the parable of the Sower when, in fact the whole story is about the seed and its fruitfulness. The story helps us understand the power of the Word – both the person and what he said. We are told at the very beginning of the bible that the Word of God is a word that brings life, that is creative, is the source of all that is good and beautiful. This week's story shows the abundance of life that comes from receiving and welcoming the Word, which is why we are encouraged to spend time with the Word of God reflecting on how it is bearing fruit in our lives. The story reminds us that a seed doesn't bear fruit all at once, it has to die, to form roots, and be nourished. It needs time to develop and grow. It would be a great shame if, all the time we are bearing fruit, we were completely unaware of it, wouldn't it? It follows that the words we speak to others, words of comfort and support, of forgiveness and love, of laughter and joy, of beauty and praise, are spoken with the power of God's Word that is positive, creative and affirming. The Sower uses us to continue to sow His word. Let's get on with it!
