

Ramblings for reflection Rights and responsibilities! People are more aware and vociferous about their rights than they are about their responsibilities. They believe that what another person does or believes is their choice and nothing to do with anyone else, that is, until it affects them personally. True, we are not responsible for other people's decisions but Jesus is very clear that we do have a responsibility to care for others and, if what they do adversely affects others, we have a duty to challenge them. We have a responsibility and duty to work for the common good and, more and more, we need to work together to achieve this. Schools have structures to help safeguard the well-being of its pupils/students and create an environment that fosters healthy growth and spiritual development, some of them statutory. Although the Church also has a code of practice, we have only one rule: to Love God and to Love our neighbour. Followers of Christ always want the best for their neighbours and those who are vulnerable or marginalised. This is a responsibility we share. Today, Jesus gives us the power to set people free (Loose) from all that oppresses them and to defend them (Bind) from all that would harm them and, as Jesus showed us, Love is the key we need to do this. That is why we gather together in his name each week to see how we can do this better.
