Ramblings for reflection

Anthony de Mello si tells us that 'Life is a banquet'. However, the tragedy is that most people are starving to death. To explain, he tells this story: "Some people on a raft off the coast of Brazil were perishing from thirst because they had no idea that the water they were floating on was fresh water. The river was coming out into the sea with such force that it went out for a couple of miles, so they had fresh water right there where they were. But, they had no idea it was there. In the same way, we are surrounded with joy, with happiness, with love and yet most people have no idea of this whatsoever. The workers in the Kingdom of God, that is you and me, know that they are surrounded by joy and happiness and love and the presence of God; so much so, that they do not give a second thought to whether they will be paid or not!!! In fact, they are more saddened by the fact that others do not come to this realisation earlier in their lives, so they want to do everything to help them discover this.


