Ramblings for Reflection

A bright young academic applied for a managerial position in a big company. At the final interview with the director, he explained that his mother had worked hard washing clothes to pay for his studies as his father had died when he was very young. Asked whether he had ever helped his mother wash the clothes, he answered, "Never! My mother always wanted me to study and read. Anyway, my mother washes clothes faster than me". The director asked him to return home and wash his mother's hands, then return in the morning. On returning home, he began cleaning his mother's hands. For the first time he noticed that her hands were wrinkled and bruised. Some bruises were so painful that his mother shivered as he cleaned them. Tears filled his eyes when he realised that this pair of hands had washed clothes everyday to enable him to study. The bruises in the mother's hands were the price paid for his graduation and academic success. After cleaning his mother's hands, he quietly washed all the remaining clothes for his mother. They spent that night talking together. Next morning, he went to the Director's office. The Director asked him what had happened and he told him he had cleaned my mother's hand. and then finished cleaning the remaining clothes. Asked what he had learnt, he said, "Firstly, I know now what appreciation means. Without my mother, I would not have been successful. Secondly, by working together and helping my mother, I now realize how difficult and tough it is to get something done.
