





Ramblings for Reflection:

The Israel that Isaiah addressed were given everything and lost it all; being taken into exile to Babylon. Yet many of the people exiled were still good, still faithful but their leaders were not and they all suffered. Jesus vineyard story addressed to the Jewish leaders also comes true and their people reaped the consequences: Jerusalem was sacked by the Romans. The Brexit decision affects everybody in this country and we are all suffering the consequences whether we agreed with the decision or not. If we do nothing about decisions made in our name, we only have ourselves to blame not those who implement the decisions. Today, we are eminently aware of the ecological harm we have done and are doing to our planet: there is concern about church attendance especially concerning young people; we are faced with moral issues around gender and relationship. We all bear responsibility for what happens around these issues and we can all do something positive so that we are well informed and able to make responsible decisions that upholds and strengthens the common good. We can live more simply, be less wasteful. We can help with the worship that encourages greater involvement and participation of young people. We can cut through the misinformation and mythology surrounding moral choices and understand better the complexities of gender and relationships. Together, we are the new tenants in Jesus vineyard. Let us make Jesus proud of choosing us!!
