

Ramblings for Reflection:

Like Paul, the Assumptionists of the parish (past and present) wish you grace and peace. We pray and thank God for you all, because you have continually shown your faith in action, worked for love and persevered through hope, in our Lord Jesus Christ. We know and reassure you that God loves you and that you have been chosen, because when the Good News was brought to you, it came to you not only as words, but as power and as the Holy Spirit and as utter conviction. We could not ask for more. One great strength about good people is that when things go wrong they do not look for someone to blame but seek to create something positive out of what went wrong. Jesus never spoke out against the Romans and encouraged people to pay their taxes!! Yet, Jesus continually challenged the leaders of his day but never grumbled about them. He worked to guide them in the right direction, to help them use their authority and power for the common good, especially the marginalised and excluded. He tried to show the way by his actions. Whether we agree with the present government or not we need to show it the way by our actions and not just grumble about it. If the government makes decisions with which you disagree but, you say and do nothing, you are responsible for the decisions they enact. since this is what it means to live and vote in a democracy. Like Jesus we are called to show the way!
