Ramblings for Reflection:

That word humility is back! Like love, humility comes in many guises, but most of all it makes us open to others, helps us see the world as they see it and, through them, helps us see the world and ourselves as God sees. Here is someone's reflection on humility:

Humility helps you see that people who talk too much are really in your life to help you learn how to listen. That people who ask too many questions are really in your life to help you improve your communication skills. That the people who ask you for a handout or a hand up are really in your life to teach you it's not your place to judge. That people who upset you or make you angry were really put there to help you work on your patience. That those who ask for your opinion are really in your life to show you that your opinion counts, you are respected, and you add meaning to their world. That people you thought were too optimistic or too good were really in your life to show you how kind and generous people can be and show you how *vou should be treated.* Humility helps us strengthen our gifts, abilities and virtues, opens us to the richness of other people's lives, the importance of belonging, of family, the true value of life and the wonder of our God.
