Ramblings for Reflection:

When I think of Christ the King, I am sitting in front of a wood and coal fire next to him, with his arm around my shoulder with me listening to a story he is telling. It is comfortable, warm, secure, and nothing else matters; believing that this is the most perfect place to be. That's because I have never met a shepherd. If we could stop, look around ourselves and become aware of our surroundings. at any moment of the day, we would eventually become aware of the presence of God, like the shepherd in the first reading. A presence that is reassuring, comforting, and offering a sense of security. With even more time, we would come to realise that every event tells a story that reveals a truth about God, ourselves, and the world in which we live. Don't think of today as the last Sunday of the year, even if it speaks of the end times. Rather, think of it as the Sunday when our King, Jesus Christ, reminds us of his presence and his love and he gathers us around him in order to tell us the story of his life as King, which will begin with Advent next week. Now, that will be some story! "Christ's Kingship opposes the worldly logic that prizes ambition and rewards ruthlessness, by expressing itself in humility and selflessness, and affirming itself silently but efficaciously with the force of Truth." Appeal for Counters With a number of existing members having to stand down, we urgently need people to join the Counting Teams who count all the

different types of money coming into the Parish before it is banked. In all cases, no experience is necessary; training will be provided and you will be joining an existing team of 2 or 3 Counters. Counters are required for the Sunday Counting Teams who count the Offertory (Collection) money on a Sunday evening starting before the 5.00pm Mass. The count usually takes about an hour and the count comes around about once every 6 weeks. Counters are also required for the Monday Counting Teams who count all the other Parish income on a Monday morning. Again, the count

takes about an hour but comes around more regularly - about once a month. If you can help, it would be much appreciated. Please speak to Trish or contact Cheryl in the Parish Office. Thanks in anticipation for your support of this very important Parish ministry.


