**Ramblings for Reflection**: "Glory to him who is able to give you the strength to live according to the Good News!" Just prior to the great event, we are given a flashback reminding us of Mary who had complete trust and confidence in God, that, somehow, the impossible would become reality. She had the inner belief that God would provide all that would be necessary for her to fulfil her mission. She, like all her people, believed that God would send a Messiah to bring peace, harmony, forgiveness and healing to the world. We want the same for our world today and, like Mary, we are called to place our trust and hope in the imminent birth of the baby who is the fulfilment of the promise. St Paul, reminds us that we, too, have been overshadowed by the Holy Spirit so that this promise can be realised in each of us, so that, like Mary, we too will be able to bring Christ to the People we meet. "We are waiting for someone we already possess. We are earthen vessels filled with a treasure... Our earthiness is only the wrapping that must be taken off so that the gift can be seen... The **Growing In Faith** Parish Bulletin which shows the donation figures for the period through to the end of August 2017 has now been published. A copy is posted on the Notice Board in the Porch and there are copies available to take away on the tables in the Porch. The report shows that, including the tax rebate on Gift Aided donations, the Parish has so far contributed over £130,000 towards the Appeal. A great achievement - thank you to all you who have contributed and to those of you that continue to do so. Diocese wide, an amazing £25 million has been raised and, in 2016 alone, over 800 Caritas and Parish projects benefited from Growing In Faith funding. Closer to home, the Bulletin shows the distribution of the money that we have raised for the different Growing In Faith initiatives and, in that respect, it is worth noting the contribution towards the Sick & Retired Clergy Fund of the Order, which had

helped finance conversion of Christopher House into retirement flats for Fr Andrew and Fr Michael. Thank you all, again, for your support of the Growing In Faith Appeal.
