Ramblings for Reflection: Do you believe you are a member of God's chosen race, a saint? Out of love, God has clothed you in sincere compassion, kindness and humility, in gentleness and patience. God gave you the ability to accept others just as they are not as you would want them to be; the ability to forgive as soon as a quarrel begins. To unite and complete these gifts, God has clothed you with love. At Christmas, Christ offers you peace and a belief that you are an essential part, as are others, of the one body of Christ. We have so much for which to be thankful. Pope Francis in his letter Amoris Laetitia / the Joy of Love made it very clear that the family is the unique example of this relationship between God and us. There is no greater acclaim for the value of the family today. Listen to this: The couple that loves and begets life is a true, living icon capable of revealing God, the Creator and Saviour. For this reason, fruitful love becomes a symbol of God's inner life The ability of human couples to beget life is the path along which the history of salvation progresses. . . . the couple's fruitful relationship becomes an image for understanding and describing the mystery of God himself, for in the Christian vision of the Trinity, God is contemplated as Father, Son and Spirit of love. A reflection from a parishioner - When I was a child, we prepared for Mass by fasting from midnight, dressing in our best clothes, picking up a prayer book to follow the Latin Mass, made sure we had collection money and set off. Now I am an old lady, I prepare for Mass by collecting up tinned food for the Foodbank, (with mental note to add chocolate log next week), add biscuit wrappers and now toilet roll centres (the 4 I had been collecting to use for pea seeds next Spring). I no longer need to check collection money because I pay by standing order and no prayer book because I follow the Mass in English and only need to fast for an hour before Communion so no hunger pangs or fear of fainting.
