Ramblings for Reflection:

How hard it must be to walk away from fame, recognition and acclaim! Job (1st Reading) was certainly not a happy bunny. Having lost everything, he found himself isolated and alone. He lost his sense of purpose, energy, motivation and saw only a black future; abandoned, forgotten. We know that Jesus reached that point too, before his death on the cross. On reflection, we can see that Jesus' choice in the gospel was the right one. So many people with power and fame have abused their power and abused people in the process, often losing everything overnight. Too many stars have chosen the path of self-destruction with drugs and/or alcohol, stifled by the emptiness of their lives. What Jesus and Paul show us this week is that they have a purpose that is greater than any position or popularity can offer. Their purpose is simple: to be heralds and ministers of the good news of God's love and forgiveness; that, with God, you will always belong, always be valued, inspired, and encouraged and, when necessary, forgiven and healed. That you will never be alone, never. In fact, any life given and shared with and for others is reward in itself. Jesus showed this by offering his life, generously and lovingly, for us and for everyone, with no other condition than a simple Yes - like Mary. A yes that leads to life in its fullness because it is a life shared.

Ash Wednesday 14th February, marks the beginning of Lent and is a day when Christians begin to deny themselves as a way of preparing to appreciate all the

more the death and resurrection of Jesus. Churches Together in Hitchin mark this beginning by arranging a lunch for Christian Aid. It is a simple meal - soup, bread, cheese, fruit - at a cost of £4 and the proceeds will support the poorest of the poor around the world. There will be a Traidcraft stall selling fairly-traded goods. This year the meal will be held in our church hall from 12.30 pm. Everyone is invited to begin Lent together by sharing this meal. 
