Ramblings for Reflection: Each time we attend mass we acknowledge that we are “sinners”, in need of forgiveness. Leprosy is the key word this week, a disease that gradually eats away the body, until parts of it disappear completely, taking a long time to do so. In Jesus day, lepers were cast out from the community. Unable to work, they depended on members of the community providing them with food and clothing. Leprosy, then, is a clear example of what sin does. It corrodes our lives, our virtues and values. It undermines belief, hope, trust, and purpose in life. It leads us to believe that we no longer belong, that we are separated from the community (and family) and gradually our goodness, love, value and dignity disappear. However, there is also the social sin of leprosy. When the community excludes people who do not fit in: the refugee, the homeless, the mentally ill, the misfits, and turns them into object groups or statistics rather than treat them as people who seek welcome, to be valued, to belong, to be respected and treated with dignity - just as we do. In recognising that we are sinners, we belong to both groups. We now understand better that Jesus gave his life that we might have life to the full, a life given to be shared with others, without exception. Jesus always condemned the sin, never the sinner, because he saw the inherent goodness and richness living within us all just as he did in the leper in the gospel.

Fairtrade in our parish

Our Lady's is a Fairtrade parish. So what this means is that we encourage all our parishioners to use products that are produced in ethical ways with the workers who produce the goods being paid fairly for the work they do. All parish groups who use our facilities should be using Fairtrade tea, coffee and sugar and other Fairtrade products whenever possible. Outside groups using our facilities should also be encouraged to use fairtrade products. To remind us of this we are having two Fairtrade events.

14th February at our Ash Wednesday lunch the Traidcraft stall will be available for people to stock up on their fairtrade products.

4th March the coffee mornings after Mass will be stocked entirely by Fairtrade goods and the Traidcraft stall will be available also. We need help to make cakes with fairtrade goods for this coffee morning. If you are willing to help bake please stock up on Fairtrade goods - sugar, fruit etc for use in baking from the stall on Ash Wednesday and also **Sun 18th Feb** when the stall has its monthly appearance after morning Masses



We also need people to help with the coffee mornings on the 4th March so if you are able to do that and/or bake please can you let Trish or Frances Chamberlain know.

All proceeds from the coffee morning will be going to the purchase of Fairtrade Gifts For Life, for example, Education, Health, Clean Water, Farming. In particular this is attractive idea as the website says....Between 12th January and 11th April, the donations which buy these lovely cards will be DOUBLED by the UK Government as part of Traidcraft Exchange's Hidden Entrepreneur appeal. This means Traidcraft Exchange can reach twice as many people living in poverty! This Lent let's make a real effort to change make our purchases Fairtrade goods whenever possible.
