Ramblings for Reflection

Don't you think Moses would have taken more than 40 days and used up many more stone tablets if he had chiselled out all 10 commandments? Rather than thinking of the commandments as a set of Do's and Don'ts, think of them as a template for community living, to help us get the best out of our life together, inspired by God's caring presence and love. Showing utmost respect and honour, treating God with the greatest of dignity, will help us do the same for each other. Our Christian belief is not a badge we wear that separates us from others, guite the opposite; it is a way of life that opens us to others, instils a desire to show that everyone belongs. So we value life (from the moment of conception), we value others, especially our parents, and respect everything. Most of all, our belief reveals the holiness, the sacredness of people, of creation and ourselves, that otherness of everything we call the divine mystery. This is what we seek to uncover and reveal during Lent. How can we bear false witness, dishonour, reject, discard anyone or anything that is inherently Holy? Only with God will we ever discover the truth, depth, richness and value of ourselves and others. Our jealous God wants all to benefit. No wonder Jesus was angry at what was happening in the temple. What was happening there mirrored how people were being treated! We, too, are temples of God, of the Holy Spirit. We are places of prayer, deserving of respect, honour and dignity.
