Ramblings for Reflection: God was revealed to us as a relationship between the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit; different in the way that we experience them but never separated from each other. Relationship is part of the very essence of the Divinity. Made in God's Image, relationship is an essential part of our humanity expressing the holiness at the heart of all our relationships. Lent brings us to focus on our relationships with God and with each other, their importance, their value, their richness, their challenge. The word 'covenant' speaks of God's loving relationship with us which never fails whatever might happen or whatever we might think. The whole of scripture (but especially in Lent) reveals that God is always faithful to his commitment, to his love for us. The Law Jesus speaks of is also about love. The Law shows us how best to live, share, and express this love which has been written into our hearts and is part of our very essence. Love lies at the heart of our suffering for others, and, the more we suffer with and for others, the more we are captured by the power of that love. Yes, Jesus died for our sins. Yet all the suffering he endured still pales into insignificance in comparison to his love for us. No wonder we seek to make this love of Jesus more present in our lives - whatever the cost.

envelopes are available from the collectors. We are still in the period where the government will double our donations so we hope this Lent will be a good one for Cafod.


