Ramblings for Reflection How quickly things change! From triumph to tragedy. From 'Hosanna to the son of David' to 'Crucify him! Crucify him!' How could this happen to Jesus? Yet, we are easily persuaded by the majority, the loudest speaker or by what we see and hear! Too easily we believe that we were wrong about someone brought low and look to place the blame elsewhere! Why doesn't Jesus defend himself at his trial before Pilate? Pilate appeared to be looking for any reason to defend Jesus and defy his accusers, but Jesus would not comply. In the end, Pilate blamed his accusers for crucifying Jesus, and, to our shame, we did the same for hundreds of years. Only Jesus was man enough (and God enough) not to blame anyone, quite the opposite, he offers forgiveness. What is more, Jesus takes all the hatred, bitterness, cruelty, inhumanity, anger, our fears and self-seeking, and transforms them into new life, into a resurrection that opens up a totally new future. It is as though Jesus sucked in all the evil humankind could throw at him and breathed out goodness and love, hope and possibility; creating a freshness - a 'Spring' - that promises a newness only too eager to reveal itself. The great challenge is that we are invited to pass through that same depth of despair that makes us cry out with Jesus "My God, my God, why have you deserted me!" and still trust in God when all seems lost. Only then will we truly experience the gift of life that Jesus won for us!!
