Ramblings for Reflection

Every morning presents us with a new page of the Gospel yet to be written. Easter Sunday is no different, but the brightness, joy, song, and the alleluias all mark this morning out as more than a special day. This is the morning that provides the template for all other mornings. The darkness, the crushing despair of that Cross on Friday last is transformed by a life-giving brightness that banishes all evidence of evil. Today the cross of pain and suffering blossoms with all kinds of beauty, breathing hope and love, opening its arm to all of us. The death and searing pain of Friday is replaced with vibrant new life and with songs of joy and praise that even the stones want to sing. Wherever you look, everything and everyone radiates the presence of the Risen Christ. A Christ victorious! For Jesus Christ is risen! Yes. Jesus Christ is risen. Jesus Christ is risen indeed! Alleluia! Alleluia! Let Sr. Macrina Wiederkehr have the last word: "O Tree of God-Tree of Life, in the gift of your shade, I stand, my heart raised to your Creator.
