Ramblings for Reflection For those who love, life is full of surprises. SURPRISE and JOY are the two common elements of the encounters with Jesus after the resurrection. The other key theme is **PEACE**. The peace Jesus offers comes with care and concern. He wants us to know that he truly and deeply loves us, that whatever the past, whatever our failures, at this moment we are fully loved and valued. But, this affirmation carries with it a belief and a trust that we too can be instruments of love, which inspires in us a spirit and desire for forgiveness, both given and received. Jesus' gift of peace is an affirmation that we, too, are capable of great things which is why that gift comes with the breath of life - the Holy Spirit. It is as though we begin to breathe an air that is truly refreshing that desires to be shared with others and unlimited in its abundance. In fact, the resurrection air grows stronger the more it is shared. The great spiritual writers would call this 'Holiness' or 'Grace' for that is what it is. Gaudete et Exsultate - Rejoice and be Glad, Pope Francis writes: "Do not be afraid of holiness. It will take away none of your energy, vitality or joy. . . We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and by bearing witness in everything we do, wherever we find ourselves . . . . he contemplates the holiness present in the patience of God's people: in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families ....." **ተተተተተተተ**

### Other items of interest

An update on Baby Theo from Greg Hewitson – who met with Theo's Grandfather in Cyprus recently. Theo is now 8 months old and the family still firmly believes that Theo's and his daughter-in-law's survival of the horrific car crash was a miracle and that someone was indeed watching over them in their recovery as they have both made so much progress from their critical state and Theo's premature emergency caesarean. Mother has had her pelvis rebuilt from the accident and she is now home. Theo is home; he is blind in one eye and the hospital will be monitoring his development and milestones, eg mobility probably for the rest of his life but he is no longer in danger - and the family have been very grateful for parish prayers.
