Ramblings for Reflection

Jesus uses such interesting ways of describing the importance of family; most of which are taken from creation. We may not be a nation of vine growers, although they have increased in recent years, but the imagery of a vine is very comforting and reassuring. It shows us that we share in the same nourishment and yet the branches allow for all sorts of difference. There is also the indication that fruit is more of a joint effort that the result of any one individual. On face value, pruning is often seen as something negative, demeaning, degrading but, in the case of a vine, the better the pruning the better the health and nourishment of the fruit. Pruning is not only very positive it is welcomed. The other paradox of the vine is that although the grapes are great in themselves, it is only when they are crushed that they produce of their best: wine (at least wine lovers think so!). Doesn't this help us reflect more positively about living more simply and therefore more sustainably. Those who live more simply (who have pruned their lifestyle and habits) will speak about feeling healthier, having more energy and feeling more positive about themselves. A simple lifestyle is good for us. helping us to better share with those in need. . . . Our efforts must aim at restoring hope, righting wrongs, maintaining commitments, and thus promoting the well-being of individuals and of peoples. (Pope Francis)
