- witnesses.

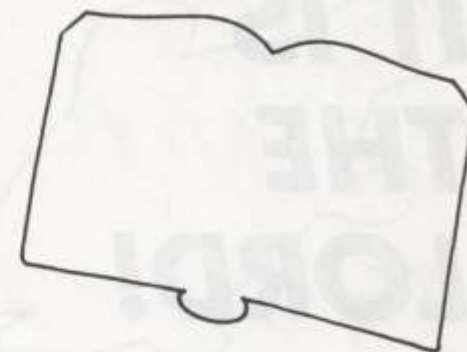
SHARING
