"I call you friends." Jesus tells us. . . Do we give friendship the importance, dignity and value it deserves? The ancient thinkers regarded friendship as one of the highest forms of love. "Friendship is not "mere" friendship, not a second-best . . . It is a love in its own right, powerful, holy, overwhelming. . . . Let us accept it as a true and passionate gift of God. If you are over 18, your help would be very much appreciated as a St Frai Helper. Some of our sick pilgrims in most need of support and medical care stay in a hospital-like building called the Accueil St Frai in the centre of Lourdes. It is well-equipped for their care and they are looked after by a team of doctors, nurses and volunteer St Frai Helpers.

The role of a St Frai helper is to support the nurses and provide the sort of care for which you don't need a medical qualification. This includes helping the pilgrims get up and ready in the morning; making large amounts of tea; taking the pilgrims to various pilgrimage events; shopping and socialising with them and other helpers and putting them to bed at night. The timetable is shared across two shifts so there is enough time to rest, make your own pilgrimage, spend time with your groups and make new friends.

Helping in the St Frai is an extremely moving and rewarding experience. Working in the St Frai is an opportunity to give our care and company to our pilgrims and make a huge difference in their lives.

# Special Report



A Human Trafficking and Modern Slavery (HTMS) event was held on Tuesday evening in the church hall. Pope Francis has said that he has "never lost an occasion to denounce human

stop Modern Slavery an occasion to denounce human trafficking as a crime against humanity." Congratulations to Elizabeth Wills from Caritas

for putting on this event which made an impact on the 110 people who attended. We are hoping to get the presentations that were made available to all the parish. In the meantime we need to be aware that HTMS is a real problem happening in our midst. In 1850 you could buy a slave for the modern day equivalent of £30,000. Now it costs the price of an airline ticket. It is the second most money making crime after drugs trafficking. Estimates are that across the world there are 45 million people in slavery – in this country estimates (which are likely to be considerably understated) are that there are 13,000 people who are slaves. When the Hertfordshire police unit was asked to manage HTMS in this county, it was first set up DS Duncan Montague. He received one telephone call per month reporting a suspicion of trafficking or slavery. Now he gets 15-20 calls per day. People often work at car washes, nail bars, Turkish barbers, in the catering industry and hospitality staff working in hotel kitchens, housekeeping, etc.

## Indicators of a person in slavery can be:

- Lack of access to medical care
- They may not speak English and others speak on behalf of them
- They don't know their home or work address
- They have limited contact with family or friends
- They have Money deducted from their salary for food and accommodation
- They live in fear of being handed over to authorities
- They could be living and working at the same location
- They have limited access to bathroom facilities

#### What can we do?

- Know the indicators and what to look for.
- Report suspicions to 101 or 999 or call the modern slavery helpline on 08000 121700.
- The police will have occasions when they find large groups of trafficked people and when they do, hopefully, we can offer support. In order for this to be co-ordinated efficently, Caritas, Operation Tropic and the Santa Marta Group will be working closely together with the parish to possibly help provide the following:
- Provide a reception centre venue.
- Provide emergency food packages.
- Provide clothing hygiene packs.
- Provide pastoral support.

- Offer specialist skills GP/Solicitors/ /Healthcare
- Offer entertainment, play board games.

We are in touch with DS Duncan to discuss the practicalities of how we can help with the above and more details will be provided when possible.
