Ramblings for Reflection:

A Christian cannot think of his or her mission on earth without seeing it as a path of holiness, for "this is the will of God, your sanctification" (1 Thess 4:3). . . . This is a powerful summons to all of us. You too need to see the entirety of your life as a mission. . . . Allow the Spirit to forge in you the personal mystery that can reflect Jesus Christ in today's world. (19,23 Gaudete et Exultate) To sanctify" or "to consecrate" means to hand something over to Because something or someone consecrated, they are given to God, and now they exist for others and are given to others. (Pope Francis) In baptism, we are handed over to God and given a mission. In confirmation, we accept that mission and are given the gifts of the spirit to help fulfil it. Our Mission is to offer ourselves in service of Jesus who is truth. It means we are willing to allow Christ to work within us and through us. Like the Apostles, we are set aside and become a source of holiness. This does not mean distancing ourselves from people. Quite the opposite. We are called to immerse ourselves among people that Christ can work more effectively through us. It is as though we live and breathe holiness, the holiness of Christ wherever we go. This is cause of great "rejoicing and gladness" (Gaudete et Exultate) as Pope Francis is and wants to remind us.

Organ update We have received approval for the new organ and the order has been placed. As soon as we have a date for delivery we will update you with the plan. We should not be without an organ at any time.

The young daughter of one of our choir members has Complex Regional Pain Syndrome which is a long term pain syndrome that can get worse over time.
