## Ramblings for Reflection:

"A thing long expected takes the form of the unexpected when at last it comes." (Mark Twain) And we know the Holy Spirit is full of surprises. Before that moment in the upper room, the disciples were waiting for the fulfilment of a promise not knowing what to expect but still gripped by fear, not knowing where to turn or what to do, except wait. Then came the wind. Did this wind drive out their fears? Was it reassuring? Did it restore a confidence they had lost? And the fire? It came to them individually, responding to their particular needs and it came to the community, as it will for us this weekend. We don't know what to expect. But the Holy Spirit, as fire, purifies and strengthens, casts away the detritus of the past to allow new growth, new life, leading to joy, confidence and passion - creating hearts burning to tell others of the wonders of God, the wonder of Jesus.

In Gaudete et Exultate Pope Francis writes: The Holy Spirit bestows holiness in abundance among God's holy and faithful people, for "it has pleased God to make men and women holy and to save them, not as individuals without any bond between them, but rather as a people who might acknowledge him in truth and serve him in holiness."(Lumen Gentium). . . . We need the Spirit's prompting, lest we be paralyzed by fear and excessive caution, lest we grow used to keeping within safe bounds. Come Holy Spirit, enliven us anew!

### Adoremus – National Eucharistic Congress

The largest gathering of Catholics in England since the 2010 papal visit takes place in Liverpool this September. We unite in worship of Our Lord truly present in the Blessed Sacrament, with the aim of promoting Eucharistic Adoration, where so many people have experienced the love and presence of Jesus. You are invited to Liverpool on Saturday, 8 and/or Sunday, 9 September. Saturday, in the Echo Arena, is the highlight of the Congress. Bishop Robert Barron, known to millions on social Media, will address the Congress; Cardinal Nichols will give a reflection and lead us in Adoration and Benediction. (There is a fee of £40 for the Saturday to cover the costs of the Congress.) On the Sunday there are Masses in the Metropolitan Cathedral and a large outdoor Blessed Sacrament procession. Many other events and a Youth Congress will supplement the official programme. You may wish to stay in Liverpool overnight. Although it will be a long day, the Saturday programme is planned to permit people to travel for the day. While coaches are cheaper, trains are much quicker - cheaper train tickets (subject to availability) go on sale 12 weeks before travel.
